

## **PGY-1 Pharmacy Residency**

### **Description of Residency**

PGY1 Program Purpose: PGY1 pharmacy residency programs build on Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) education and outcomes to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists responsible for medication-related care of patients with a wide range of conditions, eligible for board certification, and eligible for postgraduate year two (PGY2) pharmacy residency training.

The PGY1 Pharmacy Residency experience prepares the graduate to function as a pharmacotherapist within a health-system. The resident will rotate through 12 months of inpatient and ambulatory patient care experiences to foster independent clinical decision making through established collaborative drug therapy management agreements. A unique component of this residency is the 24-hour in-house pharmacotherapist-on-call program. Residents will obtain a teaching certificate through an affiliated school of pharmacy and teach small group didactic academic sessions. Residents will complete at least one longitudinal research project and a case report/ case series both of which will be presented at professional meetings. In addition, residents will complete a medication utilization evaluation (MUE) that will be presented internally at P&T.
