## **PGY-1 Pharmacy Residency**

## **Description of Residency**

ASHP Purpose Statement: PGY1 residency programs build upon Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) education and outcomes to develop pharmacist practitioners with knowledge, skills, and abilities as defined in the educational competency areas, goals, and objectives. Residents who successfully complete PGY1 residency programs will be skilled in diverse patient care, practice management, leadership, and education, and be prepared to provide patient care, seek board certification in pharmacotherapy (i.e., BCPS), and pursue advanced education and training opportunities including postgraduate year two (PGY2) residencies.

The Pharmacy Residency (PGY-1) experience prepares the graduate to function as a pharmacotherapist within a health-system. The resident will rotate through 12 months of inpatient and ambulatory patient care experiences to foster independent clinical decision making through established collaborative drug therapy management agreements. A unique component of this residency is the in-house pharmacotherapist-on-call program. Residents will have the opportunity to obtain a teaching certificate through an affiliated college of pharmacy and teach small group didactic academic sessions. Residents will complete at least one longitudinal research project and one additional poster presentation, both of which will be presented at professional meetings.
